


Welcome to your Step by Step guide "How to measure for my Shutter estimate"

You will need

Step 3 Measure each section in millimetres (mm) and write down the corresponding measurement next to a) and b), and c) d) e) f) where applicable.


Step 4 Measure each section again – just to make sure – and confirm your numbers.



The most popular style of window shutters. These cover the whole height of the opening, and can have a mid-rail added, providing greater light control.


Whether you prefer a classic or more contemporary style these may be a good choice for you.

Covering only the bottom part of the window.

If you are looking to make the most of natural sunlight, but retain your privacy, then café style is the one for you.



#### Tier-on-Tier

They have a similar look to full height. The panels are split in two so that the sections can be operated independently.

Perfect if you need partial access to your windows for easy opening.



# Skylights and Conservatories

Conservatories are designed for enjoying the sun and your garden. Shutters provide privacy, while still letting the light in and providing shade when you need it.
